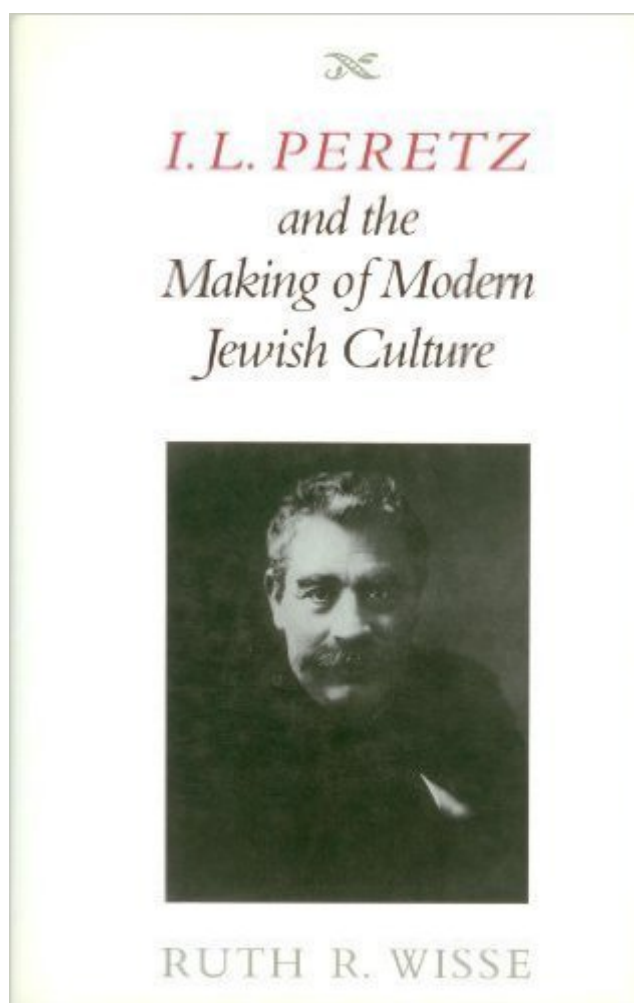


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I. L. Peretz And The Making Of Modern Jewish Culture (Samuel And Althea Stroum Lectures In Jewish Studies)
